
Save the Date!

We are so excited to welcome John Hall on stage for our 2017 benefit concert!

Best known as the founder of the band Orleans, with hits including "Still The One," and "Dance With Me," John co-wrote Janis Joplin's "Half Moon," Steve Wariner's #1 country hit "You Can Dream of Me," and also "Power,"

which became the theme of the NO NUKES concerts in the 1970s. John has collaborated in the studio and on the stage with Little Feat, Jackson Browne, Bonnie Raitt, Graham Nash, Chet Atkins and Carly Simon.



His environmental concerns led him into community activism, which also got him on the road into politics, first serving in the Ulster County, New York legislature, then as trustee and president of the Saugerties school board. Hall won a seat in Congress in 2006, and returned to music in 2011 with Orleans.
